

West Jordan Adopt-A-SPOT Program Participant Information

On behalf of the City of West Jordan, we want to thank you for your willingness to participate in the Adopt-A-SPOT Program to clean up a portion of our community. Your efforts will make a big difference and others will enjoy the results your hard work.

For your convenience, we would like to provide you with the following information that may be helpful to you as you consider the safety of your group. If you have any questions regarding the area where you are providing cleanup, please contact Brian Clegg at 801-569-5711.

1. Coordination of group efforts may be simplified if each member can be easily identified as a member of the group (for example, similar clothing, t-shirts, vests).
2. If your cleanup area is along a street, vehicles will be moving in excess of 25 miles per hour along the traveled way.
 - A. No clean up should be performed in the travel way or along the asphalt shoulders.
 - B. Drivers may not be aware of the group's presence. The City will not set up any signs or other advance warning to notify travelers of the group's presence.
 - C. Traffic conditions vary at different days and times.
 - D. Drivers may be less likely to notice group members in inclement weather or other low light conditions.
 - E. The ability of group members to stay aware of their surroundings may be impaired by intoxication, personal music listening devices or working with their backs to a street.
 - F. Flying debris may be kicked up by passing vehicles.
3. Litter being removed may contain various hazards. Do NOT attempt to remove any of the following items. Please notify the Public Works Department of these items and their locations.
 - A. Medical waste such as needles, rubber gloves, tubes or IV bottles.
 - B. Bottles, cans or other containers with unknown liquid in them.
 - C. Any very large, heavy, sharp or any items that are difficult to handle.
 - D. Any item that is considered suspicious. When in doubt, call Public Works.
4. Be prepared for possible weather conditions. For example, provide or encourage appropriate clothing in cold or wet conditions and drinking water during warm/hot conditions.
