

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

City programs help with fall cleanup



Fall is a great time to enjoy the mild weather before winter hits and make sure our yards are ready for the cold weather. The city's green waste program is a great tool to help dispose of yard waste and recycle it into usable compost. Did you know that putting your grass clippings, plants and small tree branches in the green containers helps the community by saving space in the landfill and saving money? The city is charged for every truckload of garbage that is dumped at the landfill, but we get a reduced disposal credit for every load of recyclable material. The last green waste collection of the season takes place on your regular trash pickup day the week of Nov. 24. The program starts up again April 6, 2015.

Another handy tool for fall cleaning is the Neighborhood Cleanup program. You can order a large dumpster to be placed on or near your property to help dispose of all those things that don't fit in your regular container. There is typically a waiting list for this free program, so plan accordingly. You can reserve a dumpster online at WJordan.com under the "Residents" tab and then "Neighborhood Programs" tab or you can place an order in person,

during regular business hours, at our Public Works building on 8030 S. 4000 West.

The city also has a free e-waste recycling and document shredding program to help extend the life of the landfill and protect personal information. Our next event is Saturday, Nov. 1, from 10 a.m.-noon in the west parking lot behind Fire Station #52, 7950 S. 1825 West. Residents can bring up to two "bankers boxes" of paper for shredding and residential electronic waste for recycling. Documents will be shredded on site and hard drives can also be shredded if they have been removed from the computer. We offer this service four times each year.

We also have two glass recycling drop off bins. One is located in the parking lot behind Fire Station #52 at 7950 S. 1825 West, and the other is at the intersection of 7800 South and New Sycamore Drive (7025 West).

Green Waste

COLLECTION ENDS ON YOUR REGULAR PICK UP DAY THE WEEK OF NOVEMBER 24

Green waste pick up is coming to an end for the season so plan now to complete your fall yard projects. The last collection will be on your regular collection day the week of Nov. 25. Green waste collection will resume Monday, April 6, 2015. Remember to keep the green clean and place only loose grass clippings, leaves, non-treated wood, small tree branches and dirt-free vegetative matter in the container.

Keep it Clean

- DO NOT bag any items.
- Please DO NOT put dirt, sod, cardboard, garbage, debris, concrete, rocks, or plastic bags in the container.
- All materials should fall freely from the container when dumped.
- Please do not overload. Lid of the container must close completely and branches should not stick out of the container.
- Place container curbside by 6:30 a.m. on your scheduled collection day during green waste season.

Shredding and e-waste recycling November 1 from 10 a.m.-noon

West Jordan residents can bring up to two “bankers boxes” of paper for shredding and residential electronic waste on Saturday, Nov. 1 from 10 a.m.-noon. Documents will be shredded on site in the west parking lot behind Fire Station #52, 7950 S. 1825 West. Hard drives can also be shredded if they have been removed from the computer. This new residential recycling program will be offered four times each year. Bring proof of residency or city employment (driver’s license, utility bill or city ID badge). Two glass recycling drop off bins are also located in the parking lot behind Fire Station 52 at 7950 S. 1825 West and on the side road next to Fire Station 55 at 7725 S. 6440 West.

PUBLIC NOTICE

A public hearing will be held Wednesday, October 22, at 6 p.m. in the West Jordan City Council Chambers, 8000 S. Redwood Road. The West Jordan City Council will receive public comment prior to consideration and approval to amend the budget and transfer \$4 million from the solid waste fund (where there is a surplus) to the storm fund to accelerate projects to improve the city’s storm drain infrastructure.



Construction continues on new fire station and police substation

Construction on West Jordan’s Fire Station 54 & Police Substation is progressing on schedule, with all the masonry work completed. The second floor concrete has been installed, the stairway is in place and ductwork is being installed. The new station is located at 9351 S. Hawley Park Road and will serve as a multi-use facility and will improve delivery of fire services and add a police presence to the area.



The new station is being built on the site of an old station that volunteers helped build in 1980. It was torn down in February because the building was not seismically safe nor up to current building codes and didn’t adequately serve the public safety needs of the area. The new station will have the capacity to house seven firefighters and include a 50-seat community/training room. While under construction, calls for service will be handled by other West Jordan stations and neighboring agencies. The new station is set for completion by spring 2015 and will cost about \$3.3 million.
