CITY CENTER MOVING FORWARD

You may have seen an article in the Salt Lake Tribune about our downtown redevelopment project across from City Hall. This City Center project is one I'm personally excited for and feel will benefit our entire community. The project has been in the works for years but got stalled with the economic downturn. The timing is now right to move this project forward. We have a developer in place as well as a consultant tasked with bringing in new businesses to our city, including a conference center and hotel. We hope to break ground in 2017 on the City Center project, but that could accelerate as the economy continues to improve.


The developer we are working with has built many quality projects including South Jordan's City Center and The District. We have also retained a consulting firm to bring in the right business mix. In the meantime, we will continue to work with the Jordan School District, the current property owners, to find a suitable site to relocate to so they are closer to their Jordan Landing headquarters.

The City Center project will include a hotel with a conference center, office space, large and small retailers, and housing. It will also connect to the City's Civic Center by a sky bridge across Redwood Road. Our Civic Center includes City Hall, the West Jordan Justice Center, Fire Station #52, the Salt Lake County Library headquarters, the 3rd District State Courthouse, the Arena and the 100-acre Veterans Memorial Park.

The new Smith's Marketplace on 7800 South and 5600 West is another project I'm excited about. The fuel center is set to open this fall, with the Marketplace opening in early December. This 125,000-square-foot Marketplace will become a prototype for Smith's stores of the future and will anchor a new shopping center at the corner of 5600 West and 7800 South.

A new road is also being built to connect 5600 West from 7800 South to 7000 South. This section of road will open in October. Construction on the remaining section from 7000 South to 6200 South starts in January. Completion of these two sections will greatly improve connectivity in the area.

We continue to emerge from one of the worst economic meltdowns ever. While some areas of the country are still struggling, Utah's economy is one of the strongest in the nation, with West Jordan boasting one of the lowest unemployment rates in the country. Property values are also up, another indication that the economy is improving. We continue to budget conservatively and take advantage of low interest rates, and I am optimistic that the coming year will bring additional growth and development that will benefit our community.



Plans are moving forward to redevelop the southeast corner of Redwood Road and 7800 South into a city center that would include a hotel, conference center, office space, shopping, dining and residential housing. The development would connect to the City's Civic Campus on the west side of Redwood Road via a skybridge.



Fall is a great time to trim trees

Low hanging tree limbs can create a hazard for vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Low hanging tree limbs can result in problems for all involved and delay maintenance activity. When a vehicle strikes a low hanging limb, it can result in property damage to the vehicle and significant damage to the tree.

Common city tree code

violations occur in four areas:

- 1. Sign visibility** – Trees must be trimmed so their canopies don't interfere with the visibility of stop signs, yield sign, street address signs and other regulatory signs.
- 2. Clear vision** – trees or bushes must be trimmed so motorists or pedestrians can see oncoming traffic at intersections.
- 3. Sidewalk clearance** – Trees or bushes must not obstruct pedestrian travel. Trees adjacent to pedes-



trian walkways need to have a minimum canopy clearance of 8 feet above grade.

4. Street side clearance – Tree canopies that extend over streets need to provide canopy clearance of at least 15 feet above the pavement. Low-hanging trees interfere with motorists and cause issues for snowplow operations, paving operations, garbage collection, street sweeping operations and more.

It is the property owner's responsibility to maintain their trees and planting material. If there is a complaint or an operation that is being altered due to your trees or planting material, you may receive a visit from a Community Service Officer to correct the issue. 





Free residential disposal of household hazardous waste



If you come across hazardous household waste during your cleaning, remember it's important to dispose of properly. The Trans-Jordan Landfill, 10873 S. Highway U-111, accepts a variety of hazardous waste, including:

- Paint • Pesticides • Oil • Transmission Fluid • Antifreeze • Batteries
- Household chemicals • Ink jet cartridges • Electronic devices

Materials can be dropped off free of charge, Monday-Saturday from 7 a.m.-6 p.m. While you're there, visit the re-use shed to see if there's anything you might need. You'll find paint, household chemicals, as well as lawn and garden chemicals that are still useable and free to the public. One man's trash is another man's treasure.
